*Scarf: /skärf/ plural scarves \ 'skärvz\ or scarfs.
A length or square of fabric worn around
the neck or head. Origin: Mid 16th century:
probably based on Old Northern French
escarpe, probably identical with Old French
escharpe 'pilgrim's bag'.*

YOU WILL NEED

- 6 skeins of The Petite Wool from We Are Knitters (100g)
- One pair of 8 mm / 11 US / 0 UK needles
- One sewing needle to finish and connect your pieces

These are the stitches and techniques you'll need to complete this project:

GAUGE

Take time to save time! Spend 10 minutes making your sample ahead of time, to prevent having to adjust your pattern after you've already begun, which can take hours or days to change, especially if you have to start over completely.

The tension sample is the tension recommended for your project. It is very important to make a tension sample in a 10x10 cm (4"x4") area, where you can count the number of rows and stitches that fit in order to ensure that your tension is correct for the project. With this method, your measurements will correspond with the specifications in the schematic.

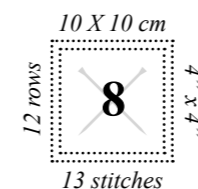
If your sample is smaller than recommended, try to knit more loosely. If your sample is larger than recommended, try to knit more tightly.

Ultimately, knitting is an art, not a science and you aren't a machine; so it's normal to have a small variation of 1-3 cm in the end.

KNIT THE GAUGE IN:

TWO COLOR BRIOCHE



INTRODUCTION

This project is worked in two colors (A y B) in one piece.

Color A = 3 skeins.

Color B = 3 skeins.

Before beginning it is important that you know how to do the following techniques:

Slip 1: To slip 1 stitch, insert your right hand needle in the next stitch as if you were going to purl it, slip this stitch to the right hand needle without purling it.

Slip all stitches: when you have to slip all stitches, slip all stitches from your left-hand needle to your right-hand needle without working them.

Brioche knit: knit the next stitch together with the yarnover from the previous row.*

Brioche purl: purl the next stitch together with the yarnover from the previous row.*

**Remember that these two stitches count as 1 stitch.*

Slip 1 with a yarnover:

When you are working a row where you are knitting all stitches: bring the yarn to the front of your work, slip 1 purlwise, place your yarn in back of your work to knit the next stitch.

When you are working a row where you are purling all stitches: slip 1, bring the yarn over the needle to the back. Bring the yarn to the front of your work again, under the needle, to work the next stitch.

START KNITTING

1. Cast on 39 stitches with color A onto one of the wooden needles.

2. Work rows 1 to 6 in 1x1 rib stitch, this means:

Odd rows: knit 1, purl 1*. Repeat until the end of the row.

Even rows: purl 1, knit 1*. Repeat until the end of the row.

**ATTENTION! When, in the same row, you work a knit stitch followed by a purl stitch (or vice versa), you have to change the position of your working yarn. Place the working yarn in front of your work to make a purl stitch and place the working yarn in back of your work to make a knit stitch.*

3. Work rows 7 to 274 in brioche stitch, this means:

Row 7: With color A. Knit 1, *place yarn in front of your work, slip 1, knit 1*. Repeat from * to * until the end of the row.

Slip all stitches.

Row 8: Change to color B. Slip 1, *work 1 brioche purl, slip 1 with a yarnover*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, work 1 brioche purl, slip 1 with yarn in front.

Turn your work.

Row 9: With color A. Purl 1, *slip 1 with a yarnover, work 1 brioche purl*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, slip 1 with a yarnover, purl 1.

Slip all stitches.

Row 10: With color B. Slip 1 with yarn in back, *work 1 brioche knit, slip 1 with a yarnover*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, work 1 brioche knit, slip 1 with yarn in back.

Turn your work.

Row 11: With color A. Knit 1, *slip 1 with a yarnover, work 1 brioche knit*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, slip 1 with a yarnover, knit 1.

Slip all stitches from one needle to the other to work the same row with color B.

Row 12: With color B. Slip 1 with yarn in front, *work 1 brioche purl, slip 1 with a yarnover*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, work 1 brioche purl, slip 1 with yarn in front.

Turn your work.

Row 13: With color A. Purl 1, *slip 1 with a yarnover, work 1 brioche purl. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, slip 1 with a yarnover, purl 1.

Slip all stitches.

Row 14: With color B. slip 1 with yarn in back, *work 1 brioche knit, slip 1 knitwise with a yarnover*. Repeat from * to * until there are 2 stitches left, work 1 brioche knit, slip 1 with yarn in back.

Turn your work.

Repeat rows 11 to 14 until you reach row 274.

4. Work rows 275 to 280 in 1x1 rib stitch.

5. Cast off all stitches.

JOIN AND FINISH

Once you have finished knitting your scarf it will look like the image in the diagram.

To finish, make a knot and weave in the tail end of yarn about 3 inches, cut off even with the fabric. Weave in any loose ends in the same way.
